### Session 1 Friday Feb. 10

#### Socialism in New Zealand Presenter: Professor Erik Olssen

Emeritus Professor Olssen's main area of interest is the relationship between politics, society, ideas, culture, and economics.

#### Liberalism *versus* conservatism in New Zealand Presenter: Professor Tom Brooking

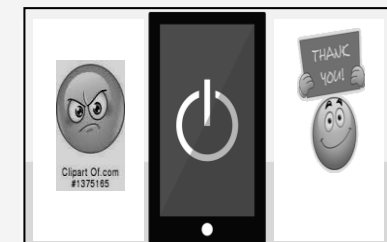
