

Series 2 – "The History of Medicine: A Miscellany"



Terence Doyle - Biography

Terence Doyle is Emeritus Professor in the Department of Medicine at the University of Otago.

After teaching medical students and practicing in Dunedin Hospital for many years, he has recently retired from clinical work. He is now involved full-time in researching and teaching History of Medicine.

Session 1: Friday 10th March 2023
Presenter: *Professor Terence Doyle*"Cholera and the Broad Street Pump"

In the nineteenth century, repeated epidemics of cholera struck London and elsewhere. This talk looks at how sanitation and cleanliness have contributed to human health, in the face of such diseases throughout history.

Session 2: Friday 17th March 2023

Presenter: Professor Terence Doyle

'Medicine and the Golden Age of Islam, 700 - 1200'

Baghdad, built in 762, became an unrivalled intellectual center between the collapse of the Roman Empire and the dawn of the Renaissance.

Successive enlightened Caliphs, like Harun al-Rashid (of The Thousand and One Nights), promoted the study of Medicine and Science; and built a system of hospitals extending from Iraq to Spain, in what was known as the Islamic Golden Age.

Session 3: Friday 24th March 2023 Presenter: *Professor Terence Doyle* "The Natural History of Quackery"

This discussion will survey the evolution and success stories of alternatives to conventional medicine; from 'Quackery' in the 18th and 19th centuries to the 'Complementary Medicines' of today.

Session 4: Friday 31st March 2023

Presenters: Mr Murray Pfeifer, Mrs Nola Calvert, Professor Terrance Doyle "Detecting and Managing Breast Disease"

In the early 1990s Government decided to introduce breast screening to New Zealand. The first such unit was the Otago – Southland screening programme.

At the same time the Southland Mammography Trust was established. This talk will tell the story of how this all came about.
