

Series 7 - Roads from Home

Session 1 : Friday 13 October 2023

Presenter: Tim Fletcher

Father, husband, teacher, dancer, artist, dual national, creator, choreographer, systems thinker, problem solver, film maker... are all roles I have had or still fulfill.



After leaving Invercargill in 1995 I studied psychology and then dance which took me overseas, where I stayed for 18 years. Our family moved to Invercargill in the middle of the pandemic, right into the house next to the one I grew up in. My parents still live next door.

Nothing in my life went or is going to plan and I love it. The skills I have learnt and the people I have met through the arts, education and living overseas have made me adaptable in a range of contexts. This is a collection of stories that illustrates that life is not linear and that things not going to a plan doesn't mean failure.

David Hunt left Southland for a career in environmental management. Initially with the NZ Forest Service then transferred to the Department of Conservation (DOC) on its creation in 1987 until he retired in April this




year. He has completed a double major degree in Botany and Geography.
