#### **Treaty Settlements**

Mr Charlie Tawhiao is the Chair of both Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Te Rangi Iwi Trust and the Ngāi Te Rangi Settlement Trust. He has successfully led Ngāi Te Rangi through social, economic and political change. Mr Tawhiao's previous career was in the public service, including as Treaty Relationships Manager at the Department of Corrections, and with LINZ. He is a native speaker of Te Reo Māori and is well versed in Tikanga.

### Session 3 Friday May 21 Presenter: Jocelyn Harris Clementine Churchill

Professor emerita Jocelyn Harris, CNZM, Ordre du mérite, gained her PhD from the University of London in 1968, then taught for thirty-four years in the Department of English at the University of Otago. In 1971, she published an edition of Samuel Richardson's seven-volume novel "Sir Charles Grandison," and in 1986 a book about him. (2017).

## Session 4 Friday May 28 Presenter: Dr Anne Ford Senior lecturer, Archaeology UoO From Africa to Aotearoa

The journey of humans from Africa to the Pacific and then finally to Aotearoa is a story of two stages. This presentation will investigate what we know of how modern humans emerged out of Africa and how they first entered the Pacific at around 50,000 years ago, where they travelled as far as the Solomons Islands before stopping for thousands of years. These first ancestors were joined by a second wave of people known as the Austronesians, who came into the Pacific around 3300 years ago, heading out into Remote Oceania, before finally reaching New Zealand, which was the last large landmass colonized by humans.

## Session 5 Friday June 4 Presenter: Frieda Looser Chocolate: Food of the Gods And Elixir of Empire

Frieda Looser has an MA (Hons) in History. She was a Senior Tutor in the History Department at the University of Canterbury.

Three thousand years ago, the Olmecs of central America drew strength from drinking chocolate made from cacao beans. The Maya civilization valued cacao beans as currency, and pottery vessels bearing the hieroglyph for cacao sustained the spirits of nobles in their tombs. Aztec Emperor Montezuma reportedly drank chocolate from a golden goblet, and in 1519 entertained the Spanish explorer Hernando Cortès. The knowledge of chocolate was carried by Spaniards to Europe where the 'divine drink' morphed through time and place to become the delicious chocolate bar we enjoy today. Along the way, the history of chocolate became both intriguing and delectable!
