Present-day general medical practitioners have their origins in the Society of Apothecaries, founded in London in 1617. The Apothecaries Act of 1815 granted the Society the power to licence and regulate medical practitioners and they retained that role until well into the 20th century. Notable people who qualified in medicine as Licentiates of the Society were the poet John Keats (1816) and Elizabeth Garrett Anderson (1865) the first female to qualify in medicine in UK.

Presenter: Dr Leon Goldsmith
Environment and
Conflict in the Middle East**

Dr Leon Goldsmith is a Senior Lecturer in the Politics Department of Otago University. One of his special areas of interest is Middle East Politics.
