

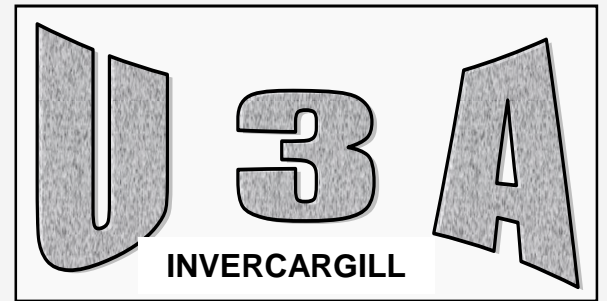

Session 1 Friday July 21 Life in Abu Dhabi & Qatar Presenter: Debbie Wills

Debbie Wills is an ex Southland Mathematics teacher who has been living and working in the Persian Gulf for the past 9 years. Initially she spent 3 years working in a local Arab school just outside of Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates. For the past 6 years she has been living in Doha, Qatar and is employed by a government foundation that is committed to improving the education of their young people, but especially the Muslim girls. Debbie will speak about her experiences in these 2 countries.

Session 2 Friday July 28 One Woman's Journey in the NZ Police Force Presenter: Tania Kura Area Commander

The first woman to make detective in 1999 when based in Wanganui. Now Area Commander of Eastern North Island based in Hawkes Bay with 180 personnel.

A truly remarkable journey.

Tania's biggest motivation has been men who said 'you can't do that'. I always said to myself, 'you just watch me'.

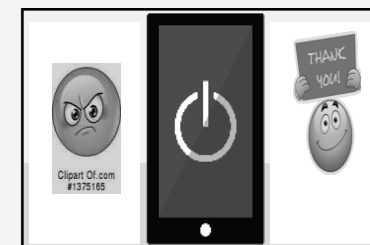
