



ASPECTS OF HEALTHCARE

Session 1 Friday October 26 Presenter: Pam Mitchell

Pam trained as a Kindergarten Teacher in 1976 before working in various areas of early childhood education. While researching special needs she discovered the "Tomatis Method". She trained and became a Tomatis Practitioner Level 1.

The Tomatis method has been practiced world wide for nearly 50 years. It has helped to improve concentration and memory as well as sleep and learning difficulties. It is now a part of the syllabus in over 200 schools in Europe.



Session 2 Friday November 2 Presenters: Jillian Boniface and Suzanne Knowler

Jillian and Suzanne are "Registered Nurse Vaccinators" who work in the "Vaccine Preventable Disease Team" at the Southern District Health Board. They will talk about the role vaccination plays in halting the spread of vaccine preventable diseases. They will also be addressing some of the myths and concerns and the need for timely immunisation.

Data capture and the National Immunisation Register will also be covered.

Session 3 Friday November 9 Presenter: Sharon Ayto

Sharon is a "Public Health Nurse" and "Child Youth Mortality Review Coordinator" working for the Southern DHB. Sharon will give us an overview of the causes of death of infants, children and young people in New Zealand. The development of the "Role Modelling Safe Sleep" in Doll-play project and her presentation at the International Stillbirth, SIDS and Baby Survival Conference in Glasgow.
