Session 1 Friday September 20 Presenter: Kathryn McRae Gemmell Lab UoO.

Dr Kathryn McRae is based at Invermay in AgResearch's Animal Genomics group, working on securing threatened species and resilient ecosystems to help to safekeep New Zealand's natural environment. Kathryn has a background in genetics and zoology. Her current research interests are focused around the genetic basis of animal health.

Session 2 Friday September 27 Presenter: Jane Young Communications Manager Strategic Advisor NZ Police Association

For most of her career Jane has been a journalist, specialising in political reporting. After working in Invercargill at the Southland Times and RNZ Jane moved to Wellington to join the Parliamentary Press Gallery. Later she became a press secretary and speech writer for Doug Graham. Janes's career has spanned print, radio, television and social media here and overseas.

Session 3 Friday October 18

Presenter: Todd Redpath Chasing Snow from Ingill to Dunedin

Growing up in Invercargill, Todd had an obsession with snowboarding, and a fascination with maps. Now, he undertakes research using satellite, drone and field data to better understand seasonal snow in New Zealand. "Todd has a PhD in snow".

Chris grew up in North Invercargill and has lived in Christchurch, Auckland, London, Taranaki, and Wellington. A mechanical engineer by profession, Chris is currently the Wellington Regional Manager for Beca. Presenter: Chris Cahill President NZ Police Association

In 2016, Chris Cahill was elected President of the Police Association, the voluntary professional body of police which represents 99% of sworn officers and the overwhelming majority of Police employees.

Chris is a sworn police officer, with a police career encompassing Invercargill to Auckland and many places in between, across a variety of work groups and from one-man stations to specialist national squads. He holds the rank of Detective Inspector.
